


From the Dog House, NEC Jim





# From the desk of Commander Pam

Summer has come and gone – taking with it longer days, baseball games, and The American Legion National Convention. Members from our Department (along with members from other Departments in The American Legion Family) attended National Convention and shared ideas and camaraderie. Those members came together to learn and perform the work of the legion on a global scale. The National Convention starts with committee meetings and trainings on the weekend before the 3-day session, culminating with the election of the National Commander. The committee meetings are where resolutions from all Departments come to be vetted by National Staff. They determine if the resolutions are ready to be approved, received and recorded (which means they are similar enough to a current resolution approved in the past), or referred to the standing committee to be further reviewed. The delegates from our Department were assigned to attend different meetings. This ensures our vote is properly heard. Many of our Alaska delegation also attended the training. The training included: Membership processing on mylegion.org, Be the One, How to run a meeting, and many more. During the main session of the convention, awards were given to our American Legion Youth Champions. These include the top prize winners from Oratorical, Boys State, Eagle Scout of the Year, American Legion Baseball World Series Team Captain, and Junior Shooting Sports. Other awards were presented to the Spirit of Service Award – for the Military Member of each Branch of service that exemplifies the best in us, the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year, and the Firefighter of the Year. These winners were presented their award on the convention stage. Alaska's own Daniel Rawson, nominated by Con Miller Post 30 in North Pole, was the recipient of the National Firefighter of the Year award. Congratulations Daniel!

We had many speakers this year but the one that impressed me the most was Lieutenant General Russell Honore, U.S. Army (Retired), Former Commander for Joint Task Force Katrina. Every year the Department Commander has a project and a platform that they work diligently towards during their year. My project is to help raise funds in support of Joseph T. Craig Post 3 in Ketchikan for their rebuild efforts after their devastating arson fire which occurred on September 10, 2023. It will be a great time to connect with other legionnaires across our Department. We will also have a "round robin" session where each post represented can speak about what is happening at their posts. I look forward to the sharing of ideas. I believe this will help us further the mission of our great organization.

At Department Convention last April, I expressed my desire to visit as many posts as possible this year. I have been to several posts this summer for official and unofficial visits. I was invited to the Interior Alaska Veterans Picnic in Fairbanks in August. This was a joint effort by three American Legion posts (#11, 30, & 57) & two VFW posts. I had a wonderful time talking to all who attended. I was even interviewed for the Fairbanks local news along with Post 57 Commander Chris Bedel and Interior Alaska Legionnaire Amanda Jones. I received donations of \$1,815 for Post 3 during this event. \$1,000 alone came from Squadron 57, showing once again that the whole Legion Family supports each other. My "Commander First Fridays" meet and greet events have been extremely fun. I have gotten to talk with the members of each post, along with raising funds for my Commanders project. From July through September, I visited posts 28, 34, & 33 in this endeavor with a total raised of \$775.00! In September I was invited to visit Lynn Canal Post 12 in Haines. I had an amazing time there seeing the post and fellowshipping with the members of their legion family. I was excited to travel there, as I had not been to Haines before. Commander Pardee and his members made me feel welcomed. While on my way to Haines, I was able to visit Auke Bay Post 25 in Juneau for their general membership meeting. I enjoy seeing different posts during their meetings. Each post is unique with traditions of their own. I am thankful for the chance to spend time with them.
